The Office of the Patient Advocate (OPA) is an independent office in state government charged with informing and educating consumers about their rights and responsibilities as HMO enrollees. The OPA provides ratings on medical group performance on the care and service their patients receive. A medical group's individual Quality Report Card is available to assist you in making the best informed decision about your healthcare needs.

Once you have entered the OPA Web Site, you may use these brief instructions for information regarding physician/medical group quality. Select the "Quality Report Card" folder tab, then click on the underscored "Doctors and Medical Groups" in blue directly below the folder tabs. Click on the bullet "Medical Group Ratings," then select the preferred county/geographical area using the pull-down menu.
